How to refer to our service

Information for referrers



The Children's Speech and Language Therapy Service helps children to develop their speech, language and communication skills, as well as their eating and drinking.

We do this by offering practical advice and setting realistic goals. Enjoyment of shared play and educational activities are key to support children's progress.

Enthusiastic involvement of parents, carers, pre-school and school staff is essential in enabling each child to achieve their goals.

Appointments

The Service aims to arrange appointments at a time/date and location that is convenient for families.

At the first appointment the child's speech, language and communication skills will be assessed.

The speech and language therapist will give advice and suggest activities that can be carried out at home and that staff can implement at preschool/school.

If a child needs further speech and language therapy, a follow-up appointment will be arranged to review the initial advice and progress.

Parents and children may be expected to attend individual or group therapy appointments.

Referral to other services that will help the child may be discussed.

Referrals

If a child experiences difficulties with any of the following, they may need a referral to the Speech and Language Therapy Service:

- Listening and concentration
- Social interaction or playing with other children
- Understanding spoken words
- Using spoken words or sentences
- Difficulties with speaking clearly
- Having conversations
- Developing literacy skills
- Stammering
- Using their voice
- Swallowing

Referrals can be made by parents or others (e.g. health visitor, teacher), who are involved in the care of the child.

If you're unsure whether to refer a child, please telephone the service for advice.

There is also a drop-in service for parents of pre-school children.
