

Who we are

We are a physiotherapy service that provides treatment for adults registered with a Bromley GP.

The Community Physiotherapy team consists of physiotherapists and rehabilitation technicians with specialist knowledge and expertise in community rehabilitation who provide physiotherapy to people who are housebound or who are best treated in their home environment or care home.

We are part of an Integrated Care Team who work closely with the GPs and includes Occupational Therapists, District Nurses and other Healthcare Professionals, to give you the care you need.

What we do

We offer assessment, advice and provide therapy for people with a range of physical problems such as fractures, immobility, arthritis, falls, joint replacements, chest conditions.

We will work with you, your carers and your family and aim to promote independence, increase confidence and improve quality of life.

What treatment will I receive?

We will visit you and complete an assessment to understand your needs and expectations and make a treatment plan. Following this assessment, your physiotherapist may offer one or more of the following:

- An individualised home exercise programme
- Support on how to manage your condition
- Advice on falls prevention
- Recommendations regarding suitable equipment
- Provision of appropriate walking aids
- Pain management

Where appropriate, referrals may be made to other services that may be of help to you, such as Occupational Therapy, Falls and Fracture Prevention, Wheelchair and Special Seating.

What do I need to do?

In order to achieve the best results we need you to participate in treatment sessions, and in between our visits, to continue with the advice and exercises as directed by your physiotherapist.

Discharge

You will be discharged from our service when you have achieved your goals, or when the physiotherapist recognises that physiotherapy is no longer helping.

You may be referred on to the Outpatient Physiotherapy Service.

It will be important for you to continue with your selfmanagement advice on discharge to ensure you maintain your maximum level of independence and function.
