

# Supporting you to stay well

## Patient Information Leaflet



### Your referral

Your GP or health care professional has referred you to be assessed by one of our clinicians. This is because your GP (or health care professional) believes that due to your complex health needs, you would benefit from some extra support to help you keep well.

### What happens next

A health care professional will visit you at home to do an assessment. At the assessment, they will consider all of your health and care needs. This support will be provided by a team of Bromley health and care professionals who are working together to deliver the best possible care for you. Your GP will be kept informed about the care that is being put in place for you.

## The benefits of joined up care

Your care will be delivered by a team of Bromley health and care professionals who are working in an Integrated Care Network (ICN).

This is a model of care that brings together a range of health and care services to work in a more joined up way to provide care for patients. This includes staff from the NHS, Bromley Healthcare, social care and the voluntary sector.

We have three integrated teams in Bromley, each covering around a third of the population. Patients have helped us to develop this model of care.

### By working in this way we will:

**Avoid duplication:** you won't have to tell lots of people your story - everyone involved in your care will know what is happening with you.

**Use the funding we have wisely:** by working together in this way we will be able to share information and identify any gaps in the care you need and help to support you to stay well.
