Children's Community Nursing Team (CCNT)



A team of specialist nurses trained in caring for CYP and their families. Offering support and care for children with a range of nursing needs, from short term treatments such as wound care, to complex long term conditions.

The CCNT is also able to provide patients and their families with oncology support and treatment within the home, as well as a comprehensive palliative care package as needed.

Hospital @ Home



A team of skilled nurses, supporting families to take their child from hospital and safely continuing their care at home. Administering intravenous antibiotics and respiratory assessments for children with a range of acute childhood illnesses. The nurses liaise with the hospitals throughout the care to make sure the child receives the right care at home without having to remain an inpatient, freeing bed spaces for children who need it most.

Special Schools



There are 2 schools within Bromley with nurse/nurse associate support for children with complex needs; Riverside and Marjorie McClure. The trained staff in the schools enable the children's feeds and medications to be given safely throughout the day, as well as providing training to the education staff around certain conditions and treatments. They also provide and annually update care plans for those children who require them.

A nurse-led service to support with bladder and bowel conditions in children and young people over the age of 5, including those with additional needs. Patients will receive regular bladder and bowel health assessments and support for toilet training skill development ensuring CYP have access to an equitable service.



Bladder & Bowel

A new team with senior GPs, consultant paediatrician and children's community nurses, triaging referrals from primary care to paediatrics providing recommendations for management or further investigation. Referring to community services or consultant/GP clinics. Thereby, providing multidisciplinary working around the CYP and families within the community.



In-Reach Service

Neonates and children with diagnosed or existing haemoglobinopathies are referred to the community nurses to discuss their diagnosis, create care plans with the families, discuss preventative measures and treatment and provide further support such as school training.
