



Making handwriting easier to read: placing the letters on the line

If where your child positions their letters on the line is a factor in making their handwriting hard-to-read, they may benefit from targeted practice using a visual strategy and associating the letters to 'sky, grass, ground')


Tip one:

Highlight a line in a bold colour so it is easier for the child to see, and get them to 'sit' the following letters on a line: a, c, e, i, m, n, o, r, s, u, v, w, x. These are grass letters. Get your child to learn their grass letters and where they sit on the line.




Tip two:

Now focus on the tall letters': b, d, h, k, l, t. These are sky letters. Help your child learn where reach on the line.



Tip three:

Now, the 'tail' letters: g, j, p, q, y. These are ground letters
